I DON'T LIKE THAT YOUR MOTHER REFUSES TO TALK TO YOU ABOUT YOUR FATHER AND WHY HE WAS IN PRISON. YOU ARE A GROWN MAN, NOT A CHILD. THAT PRISON TERM GIVES YOU STRANGE FEELINGS NOT KNOWING EXACTLY WHAT IT WAS. I GET THE FEELING HTAT THEY WANT YOU TO THINK THAT IT WAS WORSE THAN IT WAS, SO THAT THERE IS NO POSSIBLE CHANCE FOR YOU TO HAVE ANY GOOD THOUGHTS ABOUT HIM.
