Kenny Scharf, hot-shot surrealist artist, has created a monster. And with it, he's vying to unpin the red ribbon as the emblem of the fight against AIDS. The 38-year-old Dr. Frankenstein found the longtime fashion statement boring--especially for kids--so he designed a spiky, red HIV-cell look-alike: The AIDS Monster. "It's important to confront the monster and say, 'We can look at you ever day and still go on. And kill you,'" Scharf said.
