



SAMHSA Grants \$40M for Substance Abuse and HIV Prevention

The Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), a branch of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, is awarding \$40.4 million in grants to expand HIV prevention and substance abuse services, according to a SAMHSA statement. These grants are targeted at “traditionally underserved and at-risk populations,” such as young people and people of color. Twenty-seven community organizations will each receive approximately \$300,000 per year for up to five years.
