



HIV Tests for U.K. Baby After Breast Milk Mishaps

A baby girl in the United Kingdom was tested for HIV twice after hospital staff gave her the wrong breast milk on two separate occasions, the *London Evening Standard* reports. Hospital staff at Lewisham Hospital in London attached the wrong milk to Zene Hunter's feeding tube and then sent her home with bottled breast milk from a second stranger. The strangers and Hunter, now 7 months old, all tested negative for HIV and hepatitis. Breast milk is known to transmit HIV, hepatitis and other infectious diseases.
