



\$4.4M in Elton John AIDS Grants Go to Homeless LGBT Youth, PrEP and More

In one of its largest-ever grant cycles, the Elton John AIDS Foundation (EJAF) announced over \$4.4 million in new grants to fight HIV/AIDS. This includes funding nine new organizations and renewing grants for 16 others.

Nearly all the grantees are based in the United States—with one in Canada—and they “address societal trends driving the HIV/AIDS epidemic,” according to a [press release](#) from the New York-based EJAF office (another branch is headquartered in London).

“For more than 20 years, the Elton John AIDS Foundation has been committed to confronting the HIV/AIDS epidemic where it exists,” said EJAF founder Elton John in the press release. “Our newest round of grants supports exciting and innovative projects addressing transgender health, homeless LGBT youth, the continued criminalization of HIV-positive people, and the syringe services for people who inject drugs. We also remain focused on increasing access to HIV prevention, treatment and care for all.”

Since its inception in 1992, the EJAF has raised more than \$349 million for the treatment and prevention of HIV/AIDS.
