13 - Results from two studies of pre-Exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) provide evidence that

antiretroviral drugs can prevent HIV transmission. (2011)

20 - The 20th International AIDS Conference (“Stepping Up the Pace”) kicks off in Melbourne. (2014)

26 - The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) is signed into law by President George H.W. Bush. The ADA prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities, including people living with HIV/AIDS. (1990)

28 - Visual AIDS holds its first annual Last Address Tribute Walk. The walking tour honors the last address of artists lost to AIDS-related illness as well as other cultural sites of the HIV/AIDS epidemic. (2013)

1 - “Blood Supply Called Free of AIDS” declares a New York Times headline after U.S. health officials announce that a new test can successfully screen HIV-positive blood from the nation’s blood supply. (1985)
