Working without power at their downtown New York City headquarters following Hurricane Sandy, God's Love We Deliver staff members and volunteers came together to prepare emergency food kits (called "Sandy bags") for their clients. The organization delivered 8,000 meals and 2,300 Sandy bags to all five boroughs of New York City this past week. They provided meals at Project Hospitality in Staten Island, the Bowery Mission, the Community Kitchen & Food Pantry in West Harlem and to Saint John's Hospital where residents of the Rockaways sought shelter.
