



HIV Medicine Association Elects New Leadership

- Igho Ofotokun, MD, FIDSA, of Emory University School of Medicine in Atlanta; he is also a representative for the Infectious Diseases Society of America (IDSA) board of directors.
- Alice C. Thornton, MD, FIDSA, of the University of Kentucky College of Medicine in Lexington.
