



LGBT Health Awareness Week 2015

March 25, 2015

This week, March 23 to 27, marks the 13th annual LGBT Health Awareness Week. The awareness week was created by the National Coalition for LGBT Health, which in turn is organized by a national nonprofit called [HealthHIV](#).

The theme of this year's awareness week is "Time to Come Together: Trust, Transparency, Truth." Specifically, this refers to coming together across different fields and settings, building more trust in health care providers, advocating for more transparency in terms of costs and services, and telling the truth about LGBT health needs.

Scheduled events includes a webinar, a congressional briefing, a social media campaign (look for #LGBTHealthWeek plus other hashtags) and a survey for consumers, care providers and administrators.
