I finished my EP album in April 2012 and I recently released a single for my second CD called "Crossover Blessing." The proceeds go to help provide food and shelter for those in the HIV and LGBT community and to fund those who are in need. I was a counselor for those living with HIV at the University of Chicago hospital's Call Me Project. I was also a board member and co-chairman for the Chicago Department of Public Health. I'm a HIV/AIDS activist, certified tester, counselor and a certified HIV facility inspector liaison.

I'm currently a national ambassador for DeedPin. I advocate for those living with HIV—even during the difficult moments I've had to face as someone who lives with the virus. I've helped provide money and resources to those who are HIV positive. I try to help those who are not positive to stay negative by teaching them to have safe sex.
