A darling of the awards season, the film *Moonlight* follows a young Black man growing up amid the '80s crack epidemic in Miami while coming to terms with being gay. The film's two creators—Tarell Alvin McCraney, who penned the original play, and Barry Jenkins, the screenwriter and director—both have mothers who became addicted to crack and contracted HIV.

"We're not allowing the people we want to reach to be at the center of the conversation," he says. "Where's the movie about Alvin Ailey?"
