Thursday, April 10, marks National Youth HIV & AIDS Awareness Day (#NYHAAD) 2025. NYHAAD is a day to educate the public and policymakers about the impact of [HIV](#) and [AIDS](#) on [young people](#) as well as highlight the meaningful work young people are doing to fight the HIV epidemic.

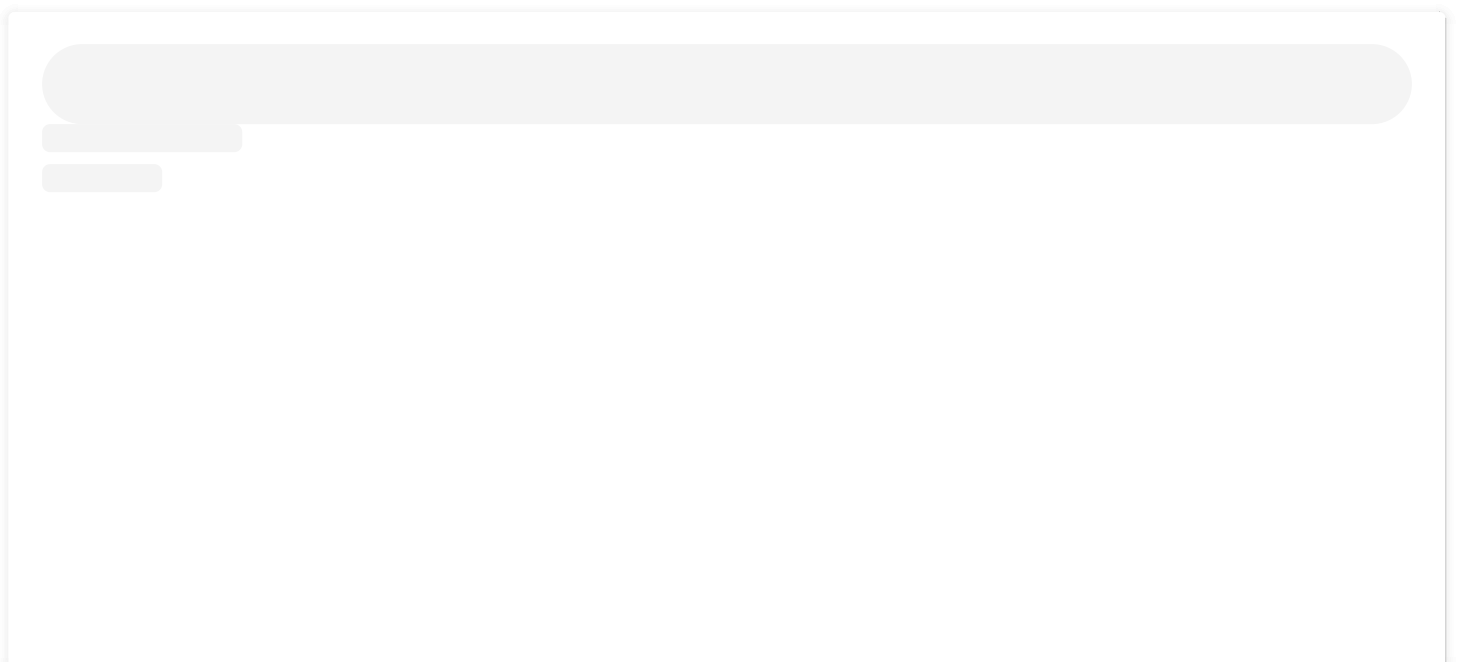

[NYHAAD](#) is spearheaded by [Advocates for Youth](#), a national nonprofit made up of youth activists working to ensure that young people have the tools to protect themselves against HIV, [sexually transmitted infections](#) (STIs) and unintended pregnancy.



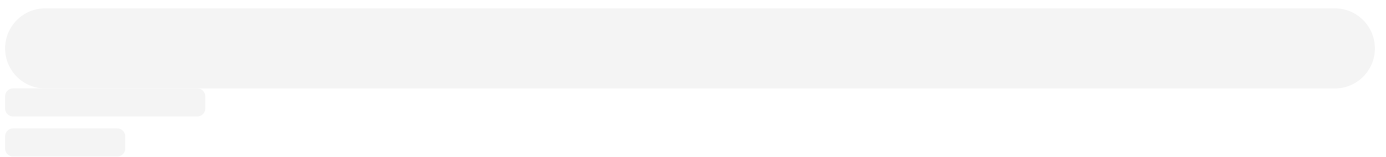

Raising awareness and getting more youth [tested for HIV](#) is vital for prevention. In fact, only 6% of high school students have ever been tested for HIV, according to the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#).

In 2021, [HIV diagnoses](#) among young people ages 13 to 24 accounted for 19% of all HIV diagnoses nationwide. What's more, condom use among sexually active [students](#) decreased from 60% in 2011 to 52% in 2021.

To promote resources, statistics and social media posts about NYHAAD, Advocates for Youth and its ambassadors created [a downloadable tool kit](#) with graphics, templates and more.

This year, each Advocates for Youth ambassador is [leading an individual campaign](#) aimed at:

- Increasing empathy and reducing stigma about HIV and its impact on young people;
- Urging local health care professionals to become HIV Prevention Certified Providers;
- Urging university deans to introduce affirming policies around HIV care, treatment, and prevention;
- Urging state and local policymakers to introduce resolutions and proclamations uplifting the day.

In addition to encouraging young people to take preventive action and get tested for HIV, NYHAAD urges health care professionals to learn more about [pre-exposure prophylaxis](#) (PrEP) and their role in addressing the barriers to care that young people face.

“Young people living with HIV are the least likely of any age group to be retained in care and have a suppressed viral load,” NYHAAD coordinators wrote. “Addressing the impact of HIV on young people requires they have access to affirming, culturally competent and medically accurate resources and tools.”

Across the nation, HIV organizations, advocates, service providers and allied businesses, such as pharmaceutical companies, promote NYHAAD.

“National Youth HIV/AIDS Awareness Day is a critical reminder that our youth face significant barriers when it comes to HIV prevention and care,” said Bithiah Lafontant, director of corporate communications at ViiV Healthcare, which specializes in HIV medications, told POZ. “Young people account for more than 20% of all new HIV diagnoses in the U.S. This must change. We have the tools and resources needed for an HIV-free generation, but do we have the collective will? At ViiV Healthcare, we won’t stop until we end the HIV epidemic for all—especially our youth. We are committed to providing resources for HIV prevention, care, and supportive services for the youth in our country, including those in underserved communities who are most impacted by HIV.”
