For the past quarter century, Oscar night has included Elton John's viewing party to benefit the Elton John AIDS Foundation. This year will mark 25 years since Hollywood legend Elizabeth Taylor received the Jean Hersholt Humanitarian Award for her AIDS advocacy. Angela Lansbury presented her the award at the 1993 ceremony, and Taylor's acceptance speech is worth watching today (and you can view it—by clicking on the image atop this article).

In 2018, Taylor's AIDS activism continues.
