Cover: Ty Ross, the gay HIV-positive grandson of conservative icon Barry Goldwater. Inside: A stunning collection of black-and-white portraits of people living with AIDS by photographer Carolyn Jones. Plus: An exclusive interview with activist and former Clinton administration aide Bob Hattoy, the first person living with AIDS to address a national convention.

June/July 1994

Cover: Dancer and choreographer Bill T. Jones. Inside: A look at the reemergence of tuberculosis as a public health threat; the hullabaloo about home HIV testing kits. Plus: A tribute to Rudolf Nureyev, the greatest male ballet dancer of his generation.

August/September 1994
