



PWN Joins Merck in Urging Women With HIV to 'Design' Treatment

Merck pharmaceuticals is linking up with Positive Women's Network (PWN-USA) and music industry promoter and HIV advocate Maria Davis to ramp up its "I Design" national HIV education campaign and help tailor it to women, according to a release from the drug company.
