



HIV/AIDS Activist Spencer Cox Dies

✖ Spencer Cox, 44, a veteran of ACT UP and the Treatment Action Group (TAG), has died of pneumonia. The HIV-positive activist wrote several columns for POZ magazine and blogged on poz.com.

He was recently featured in *How to Survive a Plague*, an award-winning documentary that uses archival footage to tell the history of AIDS treatment activism.

“One of the visceral things the film brought back for me is the rage that is still almost as fresh as the days when I first discovered it,” he wrote in a [recent blog post](#).

Mark Harrington, the executive director of TAG, told [The New York Times](#) that Cox had apparently stopped taking his HIV medications. “He saved the lives of millions, but he couldn’t save his own,” said Harrington.
