Twenty-one percent of you said you're having the same amount of sex since your diagnosis. Here are your other responses:

How many sexual partners have you had in the past year?

Zero - 24%

1 - 29%

2-3 - 19%

4-6 - 10%

7-9 - 4%

10 - 14%

How frequently do you have sex?

More than once a week - 16%

Once a week - 10%

A few times a month - 24%

A few time a year - 30%

Never - 20%

When you are having sex, do you think about your HIV status?

Always - 47%

Sometimes - 37%

Never - 16%

Do you disclose your HIV status before a new sexual encounter?

Always - 64%

Sometimes - 27%

Never - 9%

I prefer to have sex with someone who is...

47% HIV positive

6% HIV negative

47% It doesn't matter

Since becoming HIV positive, my sexual confidence has...

11% Increased

66% Decreased

23% Not changed

70% of you said a sexual partner has rejected you because of HIV.
