How would you rate your current support network?

- 21% - Excellent
- 27% - Good
- 23% - Fair
- 29% - Poor

Who makes up your current support group?

- 63% - Doctor/nurse/health care provider
- 56% - Friends
- 41% - Family
- 30% - Partner/spouse
- 24% - Case manager
- 11% - Co-workers/peers
- 10% - Church or religious community

Top 3 reasons for visiting a support group:

- 1) To be able to talk openly and honestly
- 2) To feel less lonely and isolated
- 3) To seek out information

- 60% - Yes
- 40% - No

Have you ever discussed living with HIV with a counselor or therapist?

- 54% - Yes
- 46% - No

- 42% - Yes
