Sunday, March 31, marks the annual Transgender Day of Visibility (#TransDayOfVisibility or #TDOV). The global awareness day offers a chance to celebrate [transgender](#) and nonbinary people as they face discrimination, disinformation and stigma.

“On Transgender Day of Visibility, we honor the extraordinary courage and contributions of transgender Americans and reaffirm our Nation’s commitment to forming a more perfect Union—where all people are created equal and treated equally throughout their lives,” [said President Biden in a proclamation for TDOV](#). “Transgender Americans are part of the fabric of our Nation.”

“Trans Day of Visibility is a day to celebrate the beauty and resilience of our dynamic community,” said Tori Cooper in a press statement for TDOV, the director of community engagement for the Trans Justice Initiative, at the [LGBTQ](#) advocacy group [Human Rights Campaign \(HRC\)](#).

“Trans people are powerful,” Cooper, who is also a member of the [Presidential Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS](#), continued, “we are joyous, and we’re not going anywhere.”

There are over 1.6 million transgender, nonbinary and gender-expansive youth (age 13+) and adults across the United States, according to HRC.

Search #TDOV and #TransDayOfVisibility on social media to find campaigns, stories and events (both in-person and digital). Sample posts are included throughout this article. Note that many events take place in the days leading up to and following March 31. (And ignore any conspiracy theories stating TDOV is a direct attack on Easter; although TDOV falls on the same day as Easter this year, that is a coincidence. TDOV is always marked on March 31, while Easter is celebrated on various dates.)

Transgender women, especially those of color, face a higher risk for HIV. Earlier this year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention published research findings exploring this disproportionate HIV risk. The report underscored that HIV rates were related to discrimination, violence, homelessness and low uptake of pre-exposure prophylaxis, or PrEP, to prevent HIV.
