



# USAID Grants \$5 Million to Kenyan HIV Program and Indiana University

The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) granted \$5 million to a partnership between the Indiana University School of Medicine and a medical school and hospital in Kenya to bolster access to HIV treatment in the sub-Saharan African country, the [Chicago Tribune](#) reports.

The IU Medical School joined with Kenya's Moi University School of Medicine and the Moi Teaching and Referral Hospital in Kenya in 2007 to establish a health care access program. That same year, the joint initiative received a \$60 million USAID grant to prevent and treat HIV/AIDS in western Kenya. Today, more than 100,000 Kenyans receive treatment through the program's 23 full-time clinics and 23 satellite locations.

This new USAID funding—coupled with private funding—will expand the program's network of clinics.
