Friday, October 23, is the annual Day of Action to End Violence Against Women Living With HIV, an awareness day spearheaded by the Positive Women's Network-USA (PWN-USA). Events and campaigns are held throughout the country to raise awareness of the fact that HIV-positive women are more likely to experience intimate partner violence than women who are HIV negative.

Earlier this week, the Greater than AIDS team launched [a campaign](#) titled "Empowered: Women, HIV & Intimate Partner Violence." The campaign includes videos, informational graphics and social media content—search for the hashtag #WeAreEmpowered—and it was produced in partnership with the National Domestic Violence Hotline, loveisrespect, Planned Parenthood Federation of America, PWN-USA and The Well Project, with additional support from The Elizabeth Taylor AIDS Foundation.
