Going from a 50-person mountain town to the middle of Charlotte, I ended up in Boone, North Carolina for college. Everything was going as smooth as college life could go until I entered my final year. In my senior year, my HIV status changed from Negative to Positive.

Dealing with this life-changing event was quite concerning and stressful to say the least, but I learned how to live a healthy life and be comfortable with my status. Fast-forward to a few months ago, when I was an Executive Assistant in the Flatiron District of NYC, I knew I wanted to take my professional career in the direction of HIV-related work.

But where is there a need? What is missing in this field?

It took many lunch breaks in Madison Square Park, reflecting back to when I was a student living with HIV, until it finally hit me. I immediately searched "National scholarships for HIV-Positive students" on my phone. Nothing came up. I found the need.

As I was developing The HIV League from scratch, I envisioned our organization to facilitate these scholarships, but I also wanted The HIV League to demonstrate how people living with HIV are able to live well and lead a healthy lifestyle. Therefore, our events and fundraisers (like our [SoulCycle Charity Ride](#) that's coming up) will focus on wellness.

Finally, we found a need in the general public hearing personal stories from the HIV Community, whether it's from someone who's living with HIV and living a healthy lifestyle, or someone who is HIV-Negative and acts as a support system for those living with HIV.
