Latin American countries by using their flags. We inadvertently omitted the Cuban flag by using the Puerto Rican flag twice.

That was not intentional. It was a mistake. We apologize. For online and social media purposes, we've updated the cover to include the Cuban flag. However, it's too late to reprint the cover, so print issues will still contain the error.

For those who may not know, the Cuban flag and the Puerto Rican flag are essentially mirror images. The Cuban flag has a red triangle with blue stripes and the Puerto Rican flag has a blue triangle with red stripes.

A last-minute image swap at the end of the production process created the error. Despite the similarities the flags share, this error should not have happened. As a Cuban American, I am particularly embarrassed by this error.
