What one thing has most aided your survival, and how difficult is it to overcome stigma?

Emotional support got me through the first 12 years of my HIV diagnosis. It's what helped me survive the early years, before there were effective treatments. Today, my soul medicine comes in the form of my incredibly loving and understanding negatoid partner, Gwenn.

We've shared a third of our lives together, and I'm looking forward to many more years with my best friend and lover--fortunately, they are one and the same!
